Also, I have noticed more and more cars parking on the yellow zigzag lines outside school at the end of the day. I would like to remind parents and carers that the lines are painted on the road as a safety measure. The idea being that the lines are kept clear to allow parents and children maximum visibility when leaving school. If cars are parked on the lines parents can't see and it increases the risk of an accident. Please refrain from parking on the yellow lines.

I would like to thank those parents are carers who already use the parking facilities in the village such as the chapel car park or the pavilion car park and I would like to encourage more people to use these facilities. I understand they are a bit further away from school but a 5 minute walk to and from school will be a few hundred steps towards your and your children's 10,000 steps a day target.
